

Case Study: Ian Firth Hardware Ltd

Challenges:



Ian Firth Doors & Hardware has a strong value of sustainability and has recently been focused on waste reduction and recycling. Ian Firth Doors & Hardware is committed to reducing waste by reusing packaging and palletising products to reduce carbon emissions. KPI's are reported back to the team of director's monthly and tasked against the three key pillars of sustainability for future targets.

Typically, financial cost has been a key challenge with finding the balance between being both environmentally and economically sustainable. A good example of this is polythene heat wrap used for palletising. Firstly, the heat wraps the company used was robust enough to hold the product in place while on transport and was also viable economically. However, it was made from virgin plastic. Therefore, to reduce lan Firth's carbon footprint, they swapped to a recycled plastic which was also thinner making it more economically sustainable. However, the company had significant issues with the functionality of the product because as it was thinner, it was allowing doors to move around on the pallets which resulted in a significant amount of damage. After a review, they switched to a thicker recycled heat wrap which is environmentally, economically and socially sustainable.

Impact:

Structured education: The range of different topics and resources offered by the School channel a well- balanced approach to employees understanding of sustainability. The freedom to attend training sessions on specialised topics has also driven this success.

Structured Improvement: The Action Plan feature directs employees to build a well-rounded knowledge after taking a personal assessment.

Evaluating Progress: The Assessment feature highlights the key topics the company has significant development in and others which can be focused on the future. This has been a key component to streamlining education in various topics.
